a workshop to the children all about aspirations. Children listened well and really enjoyed learning about Sams life and how he became a Paralympian.

In science this week we have been investigating things that are alive, were once alive and have never been alive. We collected and grouped items that we collected.

In maths we have been identifying coins and notes. We have been finding different ways to make the same amount.

In English lessons we have been thinking about different types of sentences, such as statements, commands and questions, checking that we are using the correct punctuation. The whole class thought of some fantastic adjectives to describe a tropical beach. We then used them to write our own description of the scene. Our DT lesson this week was making a colourful basket from the net of a cube to celebrate Ramadan.
