Squirrels Class - EYFS

This week we have been looking at animals and their habitats, thinking about what they need to survive and how different animals adapt to their environment. We have collected natural materials to make a cosy home for a hedgehog and have used clay and playdough to model our own hedgehogs. This week in PE we have been practising our ball skills, using our hands to throw and catch as well as learning team games and taking turns.

Squirrels have been locating and naming the four countries that make up the UK.

In PHSE we have been exploring similarities and differences between ourselves and our peers, recognising that it is good to be different and that we are all special in our own way.

In maths year 1 have completed their unit on Geometry while year 2 have been busy work hard on their assessments.
