

RECIPE/INFORMATION

If all classes are in school i.e. no trips, there are roughly 96 children. Badgers put a list on the fridge door in the staff room giving numbers per classroom for drinks (if it's not there go and see Jane in the office).

The drinks below are made using whole milk. The milk is usually brought in by the individuals on the rota (best to have a chat with whoever you are on with as to who brings what). As we're only on once or twice per rota the cost is not claimed but if you would like to claim the money let me know.

Hedgehogs:	Mr Starr (cups in classroom)
Squirrels:	Mrs Wilson (cups from cupboard)
Foxs:	Mr Wilkin (cups from cupboard)
Badgers:	Mrs Jack (use larger cups in cupboard but half fill)

All drinks are made in 2 large plastic jugs which are usually on the windowsill in the staff room (these jugs together provide 26 drinks). Cups are stored beneath the sink (hopefully there will be enough otherwise you'll have to wash some up). The drinks themselves are stored in the grey overhead cupboards ~~4th~~^{3rd} one from left. Hedgehogs have their own cups so you only need to take the drink to the classroom.

Milkshake: 3 x 3.408L/6 Pints. For each jug half a bottle of Crusha milkshake is sufficient. If you find you are running out you can always add water. Don't forget the taste test!

Hot Choc: 2 x 3.408L/6 Pints. 1 heaped desert spoon of hot chocolate per child. Mix with a little milk to make a paste then add more milk (the whisk is in a pot by the urn, hopefully using this no lumps!) Top up with hot water from the urn to the right temperature. Obviously don't make the drinks too hot. It may be worthwhile taking in a kettle as the urn is notoriously slow running! Alright for a cuppa, but not for a jug full. It'll speed things up as well if you do but up to you, the playground is a cold place in the winter if you don't get to Badgers before 10.30! Don't forget the taste test!

Some of the teachers love hot chocolate, so any left over won't last long!

Whatever milk you don't use either take home or leave in the fridge.

There are allergies and these are catered for by individual classes.

If the cupboard's looking a bit bare and I've been neglecting stocking up please let me know.
