


#### Foxes Class

In English we wrote some persuasive writing for living in a stone age village. We learnt about the jobs people do, what they would eat, the tools they made, jewellery worn and the benefits of the neolithic period. In history, we used skills of evidence and interpretation to suggest what the artefacts that have been found by archaeologists may tell us about these times.

#### Badgers Class

This week we have been working hard to develop an understanding of angles. This was new learning for year 5 and they have shown a really great understanding, using protractors to measure angles in different shapes. Year 6 have also persevered and shown great determination in lessons this week where we tackled some challenging questions finding angles in triangles. Polygons and quadrilaterals.

We were able to enjoy the sunshine in P.E this week where we went outside and began our topic of rounders. The first lesson focused on striking and fielding and by the end of the lesson, Badgers were able to throw and catch with greater accuracy.
