

Hedgehogs Class

This week Hedgehogs have started they story map on the 'Owl Babies' and practised retelling to their class-mates. We have really worked hard on our expression and thinking about how the owl babies felt when their mother left them. In art we had fun printing with apples, talking about halves and quarters. In maths we continue our focus on same, different and odd one out, this time working with amounts and placing them on 5 frames. We have worked really hard learning lots of new sounds during our phonics sessions and we are now working on blending these sounds together to read words.



Foxes Class

In English this week, we have continued the theme of writing to inform by researching, planning and writing a report on the eruption of a volcano in Paricutin, a village in Mexico. We used expanded noun phrases in our sentences to make our reports both powerful and informative. We then read and pre-



sented our finished reports. We may have some budding future newsreaders in Foxes class!

In maths we have continued our learning of place value, using Base 10 to represent increasingly large numbers greater than 1000.



Foxes class have been quite in spired by our project Rocks, Relics and Rumbles. We have looked at the properties of types of rocks this week, and we now have quite a growing rock collection! The children have enjoyed

finding and comparing rocks to consider if they are sedimentary, igneous or metamorphic in developing their scientific vocabulary.

Squirrels Class

Squirrels have been learning all about what deciduous and ever-green trees are. We have been investigating the trees in our



school and mini spinney. Then we sorted pictures and actual leaves. We have chosen both a deciduous and evergreen tree to monitor this year,

and we will take a photo each month to see how it changes over the seasons. In geography, we have started to create maps including physical and geographical features. Our next step is to include a key on our maps.





Badgers Class

This week, we have been learning lots of new skills in Maths. We have built on our knowledge of place value and we have been working with numbers up to 1,000,000 and beyond. We have



now mastered the skill of rounding numbers up to 1,000,000 which although was challenging at first, we persevered and got there in the end!

In Science, we have continued our topic of Space. We worked in groups and used books to research 10 fascinating facts about a given planet. We then created a poster of our findings.

In History, we continued the Space theme and learnt about Galileo and his impact on society. Badgers were fascinated by some of the facts they learnt about him!

Overall a busy but fantastic week in Badgers class.
