Squirrels Class - EYFS

This week Reception used the story Little Red Hen to support their learning of harvest and Autumn. They have enjoyed trying a range of different fruits and vegetables as well as playing with the small world farm. The children have been joining in with and retelling the story orally. In maths the children have started to compare length and weight.



Squirrels Class - Years 1 and 2

Year 1 and 2 have continued to develop their understanding of a Victorian school this week by looking at the equipment they used such as chalkboards and ink pens. In maths we have been learning addition and subtraction, as well as related number facts. The children also got to enjoy their last session of the term at Witham Hall in the sunshine.



Foxes Class

In Foxes class this week we have been looking at mountains. We used maps to look at topographical features of mountains and rivers. We also looked at a local map to find the River Glen and any hills in readiness for our trip next week.



In computing, we investigated what a good website needed. We then used Music Sound Lab to create our own musical materpieces.



Badgers Class

In Badgers Class this week, we have had an exciting and creative time exploring different subjects. In PE, we used interpretive dance to tell World War 2 stories. It was amazing to see how the students were able to portray the emotions and intensity of that era through their movements.

In science, we created posters to explain the difference between simple, series, and parallel circuits.

In English, the class has produced fabulous letters inspired by World War 2. They have taken on the perspective of someone living during that time and have written heartfelt letters depicting their experiences and emotions.















Squirrels class had our first afternoon out in the rain this week! We lay on the ground and felt the rain on our faces. We completed two Go Green Challenge activities. The first one was to have a lesson outside and the Reception class did a maths lesson. The year 1 and 2 children learnt all about trees, the year 1 children need to know what evergreen and deciduous trees are and the year 2 children need to start naming trees.



Badgers love playing the team building games, this week we had the challenge of carrying our balls with our using hand or feet and you must work with their partner. Everyone did it with different methods. We also worked on naming trees around school, to complete the Go Green Challenge we need to name 15 different trees in our area.
